



ST Helena is situated at lititude 15°56' south and longitude 5°42' west in the South Atlantic Ocean, 1,600 km from the west coast of Africa, 1,100 km southeast of Ascension Island, the nearest land mass and 2,700 km north-west of Cape Town. Volcanic in origin the island rises to a peak of 820 m. The interior is fertile and capable of sustaining a wide range of fauna and floa contrasting with a rugged and barren coastline. Although located within the tropics the climate is mild year-round due to the effect of the south east trade winds. Temperatures vary from 16 to 27 Celsius during the winter to 21 to 31 celsius in the summer. Annual rainfall averages 15 centimetres on the coast to 100 centimetres in some inland areas.

The legislature comprises a Legislative Council which consists of the Speaker, twelve elected members and three ex-officio members (Chief Secretary, Financial Secretary and Attorney General). All legislation passed by the Legislative Council has to be approved by the United Kingdom Government. Five committees of the Legislative Council are responsible for the general o versight of the activities of government departments and have in addition a wide range of statutory and administrative functions. An Executive Council consisting of the five chairmen of the council committees and the three ex-officio members of Legislative Council advise the Governor. The Governor of St Helena, who is appointed by HM the Queen on the advice of the United Kingdom Government, is also Governor of its dependencies, Ascension Island and Tristan da Cunha but the St Helena Government has no jirisdiction in either of these dependencies.







Chart 2.5 Age Structure of St Helenian Residents 1976, 1987 and 1998
