

EXTRACTS FROM DR. LORAM'S LETTER.

The scholarship for Matthews is not a Carnegie gift by a "special fellowship of \$1000 which the Phelps Stokes Fund and Yale University have created" (It took some wangling I'll tell you). There is no certainty that the fellowship will be continued after this year but I shall try again at the right time.

I enclose a letter which I have had from Dean Furniss which please return. I also enclose a form for Matthews to fill up and forward direct to Dean Furniss. He should add some such note as this "with reference to your letter of March 10 addressed to Professor C. T. Loram I have pleasure in accepting the special fellowship of \$1000 which the Phelps Stokes Found and Yale University have created. I enclose herewith the application blank duly filled in" A similar letter of thanks and acceptance to the Phelps Stokes Fund would be proper.

I advise that Matthews register in the Department of Education where I have reserved him a place.

Matthews should see that his S. A. papers are in order. You probably have an agent in London. If not, the Int. Missionary Council Edinburgh House, 2 Eaton Gate will look after him. He must not fail to advise the P.S.F. of the Steamer by which he travels to New York. If necessary, they will arrange to have him met at the docks. If Matthews has time to spend in New York the best place for him to put up would be International House, 500 Riverside Drive.
