

THE COMPLAINTS OF SHESHUGU

1. In 1939 the Council wanted to shift all the Natives in the Sheshegu rural area. Mrs. Ballinger knows that.
2. The Native Commissioner of Alice made a dipping tank, for dipping sheep and goats. The people rejected it for they had their own.
3. On the 9th of September, 1941, a Native Commissioner came to elect a Native Representative for the Bunga. He was given a man but he put another man in instead.
4. In November, 1941, the Stock Inspector came in Sheshegu area or village and stopped all the cattle from moving out of Sheshegu for he said that we did not want to bring the blood spleen to his office. But those of the farmers around us were allowed to move anywhere they liked.
5. The Native Commissioner again brought the wind mill to this area. The people refused it for they had plenty of water, but he forced it through. All these matters cost us a lot of money that is why we appeal to you to investigate this matter.
