REPORT OF THE COUNCIL OF THE UNIVERSITY FOR THE SIXTEEN MONTHS ENDED 31st DECEMBER, 1874.

1. The Council of the University has the honour to furnish to His Excellency the Governor the following report of its proceedings during the year ended 31st December, 1874. It will be convenient to include in this report a statement

of proceedings during the last four months of 1873.

2. At the first meeting of Council, held on the 1st of September, 1873, Langham Dale, Esq., LL.D., was elected Vice Chanceller, and the Rev. James Cameron, LL.D., was elected Registrar. The vacancy in the Council, caused by Dr. Cameron's acceptance of the Registrarship, was filled up by the appointment of the Rev. G. F. Childe, M.A., to be a member of the Council.

3. Rules of order and procedure and by-laws and regulations for the conduct of the various University examinations have been framed by the Council, and published for general information after receiving the approval of His Excellency

the Governor.

5. The first matriculation examination was held in July, 1874. The number of candidates for this examination was forty-nine, of whom thirty-one passed the examination—fourteen of them with honours. Competitors for this examination were furnished from the South African and Diocesan Colleges; the Gill College, Somerset East; the Kafir College, Zonnebloem; St. Andrew's College, Graham's Town; the Wesleyan Collegiate School, Queen's Town; and public or private schools in Cape Town, Stellenbosch, Paarl, Clanwilliam, Mossel Bay, Graham's Town, Somerset East, and Alexandria. The examination was held simultaneously in Cape Town, Stellenbosch, Graham's Town, Somerset East, and Queen's Town. The University exhibitions, each of the annual value of £30, and tenable for two years, were awarded to R. Gregorowski, of the Gill College, Somerset East; and M. W. Searle, of the Diocesan College, Rondebosch.

6. The first examinations for degrees, and for certificates of proficiency in law and the theory of land-surveying, were held in October, 1874. The results

of these examinations were as follows:-

(a) For the degree of Master of Arts one candidate, Mr. R. Sheard, presented himself, having selected the department of languages and literature. He

was successful in passing the examination.

(b) For the degree of Bachelor of Arts nine candidates presented themselves, from the South African and Gill Colleges and the Stellenbosch Public School. The examination was held in Cape Town and Somerset East simultaneously. Of six candidates who were successful in passing the examination, two were entitled to honours in literature and science, and three to honours in literature.

- (c) For the certificate of proficiency in law and jurisprudence nine can didates presented themselves for examination—eight in Cape Town and one in Somerset East. Eight of the nine candidates were found to be entitled to the certificate.
- (d) For the certificate of proficiency in the theory of land-surveying there were two candidates, one of whom obtained the certificate.

In connection with the B.A. examination, the University Scholarships in Literature and Science, each of the annual value of £50, and tenable for two years, were awarded to Mr. F. C. Kolbe, of the South African College. Mrs. Jamison's Scholarship, of the annual value of £200, and tenable for four years, was also awarded to Mr. Kolbe. As one of the conditions of the tenure of Mrs. Jamison's Scholarship is that it shall not be held in addition to any other scholarship of the University, the Council has permitted Mr. Kolbe to retain the title of University Scholar in Literature and Science without being allowed to draw the emoluments attached to the University scholarships.

7. The subject of a system of school examinations to be undertaken by the University is one that has received the close and careful attention of the Council during the year. The Council, after long deliberation, and with information and evidence obtained from every available source before it, has resolved to hold examinations of candidates for certificates of proficiency in elementary subjects of instruction, and to issue certificates to such as reach a standard prescribed by the University. The regulations for these examinations have been published, and special examiners have been appointed. The first examination will be held

in April, 1875.

8. The resignation of Sir Sydney S. Bell and of the Rev. John Brebner, M.A., and the absence from the Colony of W. Porter, Esq. and the Rev. G. F. Childe, M.A., left four vacancies in the Council, which have been filled up as follows:—

9. The Hon. J. H. de Villiers, Esq., Chief Justice of the Colony, has been elected President of the Convocation of the University.
