CAPE OF GOOD HOPE.

Report of the Council of the University of the Cape of Good Hope for the Year 1889.

Presented to both Pouses of Parliament by command of Pis Excellency the Gobernor.

1. The Council of the University of the Cape of Good Hope has the honour to present to His Excellency the Governor the following Report of

its proceedings during the year 1889.

2. The vacancy in the Council caused by the death of the Rev. W. B. Philip, B.A., alluded to in the last Report, was filled by the Convocation of the University, which elected A. A. Bodkin, Esq., M.A., to the vacant seat. The only vacancy which has arisen during the year was caused by the resignation of the Hon. J. Tudhope, Esq., M.L.A.. The Government appointed the Most Reverend Bishop Jones, D.D., to fill the vacant seat.

3. The Hon. Mr Justice Smith has been reappointed by the Council to

a seat on the Council of the South African College.

4. The School Examinations conducted by the University were held in March, at 80 different centres in this Colony, the Orange Free State, the Transvaal Republic, and British Bechuanaland. At the Elementary Examination 915 candidates presented themselves, of whom 610 passed. At the Higher Examination 193 candidates were examined, of whom 162 passed. 8. New Regulations for the University Fellowship have been framed by the Council and approved by the Government. These Regulations are pub-

9. The Council has offered the J. B. Ebden Prize for competition in 1890. The subject for the Essay is "On the advantages, or otherwise, of a Customs Union, whether general or partial, for the different Colonies and States of South Africa."

10. The Hon. Mr. Justice Smith, M.A., LL.D., has been elected Vice-Chancellor of the University in succession to Sir Langham Dale, LL.D.

11. A standing Committee of Studies has been again appointed to assist the Council in matters connected with the examinations. The Members of the Committee are Mr. Bodkin, Professors Foot, Hahn, MacOwan, Ritchie, Thomson, and Walker Drs. Kelbe and Van Oordt, Hon, C. A. Smith.

The Annual ceremony of conferring degrees was held in the Public Library, in September, when the Vice-Chancellor, in the presence of the Council and the Convocation of the University, conferred degrees upon those whom the Council had declared to be qualified to receive them. The Council took this opportunity of presenting an address to the retiring Vice-Chancellor, Sir Langham Dale, congratulating him on the honour of Knighthood conferred upon him by Her Majesty the Queen, and recognizing his important services to the cause of Education in the Colony. The Vice-Chancellor thanked the Council for the address, and proceeded to review the work of the Academical year.

13. The Council desires to acknowledge the liberality of the Legislature in increasing the grant to the University, and in voting a sum of money for bursaries to poor students. With the means thus put at its disposal, the Council believes that it will be able to carry out with greater efficiency and

success, the important duties with which it is charged.
