Report of the Council of the University of the Cape of Good Hope for the year 1903.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by Command of His Excellency the Governor
1904.

1. The Council of the University of the Cape of Good Hope has the honour to present to His Excellency the Governor the following Report of its proceedings during the year 1903.

11. With reference to the appointment of Standing Committees the following resolutions were adopted :

I. That all Standing Committees hold office for two years.

II. That each Committee be empowered not only to deal with matters referred to it by the Council, but also to submit from time to time, for the consideration of the Council, any recommendations which it may deem desirable to bring to the notice of the Council with reference to other matters naturally related to the interests with which the Committee is specially charged.

III. That the duties of the Vice-Chancellor's Committee be as follows :—

To deal in the interval between Council Meetings with matters of routine (including those of finance), or of minor importance, and with matters requiring immediate attention, all such matters dealt with being reported at the next meeting of the Council.

IV. That each Committee of Studies should include, along with members of Council, other persons, to be invited and appointed by the Council, whose co-operation may be of value to the Committee, such Assessors to have the right of voting on all matters dealt with by the Committee, and to receive the same travelling allowances as Members of Council.

V. That the duties of the Examiners' Committee shall be as follows :—

1. To draw up annually a preliminary list of Examiners for submission to the Council at the meeting at which Examiners are appointed.

2. To fill up all vacancies in examinerships that may occur after the appointments have been made by the Council.

VI. That the Honorary Degrees Committee, in addition to its other functions (see Calendar 1903-1904, pp. 67-81) be entrusted with the duty of considering and reporting upon applications for admission *ad eundem gradum*.

22. The Council is pleased to report that considerable progress has been made with the scheme for the erection of the proposed University Buildings. Sixty competitive designs were received, and, on the recommendation of Mr. Aston Webb, the first premium was awarded to Mr. W. Hawke, of London. It has been decided to adopt his plan with such modifications as may be agreed upon as a result of discussion when he visits Cape Town in February.

23. It is with great pleasure that the Council is able to report the institution in honour of her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, of a new Scholarship, entitled the "Queen Victoria Memorial Scholarship," of the value of £200 for three years, founded by the Women of South Africa, to be awarded under certain conditions to the girl candidate who at the Intermediate Examination in Arts obtains the highest place in the First Class.

24. The funds subscribed for the above purpose by the Women of South Africa also furnish an Exhibition of £50 for one year to be awarded, under certain conditions, to the girl candidate who at the Matriculation Examination obtains the highest place in the First Class.

25. The Council is further pleased to report the institution of a prize called the "Queen Victoria Prize," the funds for which were subscribed by the Jewish boys and girls of South Africa. The prize, consisting of books to the value of £4, is to be awarded annually to the candidate at the Matriculation examination, who has, in the opinion of the examiner, written the best English Essay.

26. The Regulations governing the award and tenure of Scholarships have been revised to suit the new scheme of the B.A. Examinations.

27. In order to meet the requirements of the new syllabus for the B.A. Science Examination, the practical examination in the Department of Physics was held this year at Cape Town and Stellenbosch.

28. The amended Regulations for the Intermediate Examination came into force this year, and further amendments have been introduced into the Dynamics Syllabus of this Examination for 1904.

29. With reference to the Matriculation Examination no change has been made in the Syllabus, but some of the papers have been divided into two parts in order to expedite the work of examination.

30. In the School Higher Examination a slight re-distribution of the subjects of the two English papers has been made, and at the School Elementary Examination the Arithmetic paper has been divided into two distinct parts.

31. In order to meet the views of the Examiners nominated by the Associated Board of the Royal College of Music and the Royal Academy of Music, modifications of a slight nature have been introduced in the Regulations for the Music Examinations, and the period of tenure of the Music Exhibition has been increased from two to three years.

32. It having been found inexpedient to publish all University news in the "Government Gazette," the publication of an official organ of the University has, during the past year, been commenced, containing such information as it is deemed advisable to publish.

33. The Council tenders its grateful thanks to the Legislature for the continuance of the usual grants for General Purposes and for Bursaries, and for the special grant to defray the expense of the publication in the "University Gazette" of such matters as are not published in the "Government Gazette."
