Report of the Council of the University of the Cape of Good Hope for the Year ended 31st December, 1907.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by Command of His Excellency the Governor.
1908.

1. The Council of the University of the Cape of Good Hope has the honour to present to His Excellency the Governor the following Report of its proceedings during the year 1907.

2. A vacancy in the Council, caused by the resignation of Advocate Smuts, one of the members for the Transvaal, was filled by the appointment of the Hon. Mr. Justice Wessels, B.A., LL.B.

3. The Hon. Sir C. Abercrombie Smith, Kt., M.A., was re-elected Vice-Chancellor, and the Hon. Sir John Buchanan, Kt., LL.D., was re-elected Pro Vice-Chancellor, each to hold office until the expiration, by effluxion of time, of the term of office of the Council.

18. A Fellowship of £200 per annum, tenable for two years, was awarded to Mr. J. F. W. Grosskopf, M.A., the subject on which Mr. Grosskopf proposes to prosecute his researches during the tenure of his Fellowship being "The influence of English and German literature on each other as illustrated by the history and effects of the travelling companies of English comedians and actors who visited Germany, Denmark and the Netherlands at the end of the sixteenth and during a great part of the seventeenth centuries."

This will be the last Fellowship awarded, as it has been decided to discontinue the granting of Fellowships.

19. On the recommendation of the examiners (Dr. Theal and the Rev. Dr. Kolbe) the Chalmers Memorial Prize for 1907 was awarded to Mr. S. Grosskopf, B.A., Grey University College, Bloemfontein, the subject of the thesis being "The South African Administration of Sir George Grey."

The subject selected for 1908 is "The Influence of Subject Races on the Development of Nations, with special application to South Africa."

20. On the recommendation of the examiners (Professor A. C. Seward, M.A., F.R.S., Botany Schools, Cambridge, and Mr. R. P. Gregory, M.A., St. John's College, Cambridge) the Cornwall and York Prize for 1907 was awarded to Miss E. L. Stephens, B.A., for her thesis entitled "Preliminary Notes on the Development and Morphology of the Embryo-sac in certain Penicillia."

21. Owing to the greatly increased number of candidates for the Music Examinations the Council has been compelled to arrange for the appointment of four examiners for the Practical Examinations. This step will, it is hoped, enable the work to be overtaken more expeditiously and with less strain on the examiners.

22. No change has been made during the year in the Regulations for the School Higher Examination, but a modification in the syllabus for Botany and the substitution of a syllabus in Chemistry in place of a text-book are under consideration.

The Council has also under consideration the addition of *Elementary Physical Science* to the list of science subjects which may be taken.

It may be added that the number of candidates taking this examination is steadily increasing, the number for 1907 being 1,735, as against 1,558 for 1906.

23. Detailed syllabuses for *Zoology* and *Elementary Physical Science* for the Matriculation Examination have now been prepared and issued, and the question of the issue of an amended syllabus for *Botany* is under consideration. The question of the addition of *Elementary Natural Science* (Botany and Zoology) to the list of science subjects which may be taken at the examination is also under consideration.

In connection with this and the School Higher Examinations it has been decided that in and after 1909 the methods of Algebra will be allowed in the solution of problems in Arithmetic.

24. In the Intermediate Examination the number of marks obtainable in History and Dynamics has been increased. In French and German candidates will be required to write a short essay, and the allotment of the marks in these subjects and also in Dutch has been altered with a view to giving prominence to this portion of the paper.

25. No changes have been made in the Regulations for the B.A. Examination, but it has been decided to appoint two examiners for each paper and to have the candidates' answers marked by both examiners.

26. A number of minor changes have been made in the Regulations for the Law Examinations, mainly in connection with the text-books prescribed. Full particulars as to these changes will be found in the University Calendar for the year 1908-1909.

It has been decided that the time has arrived for a revision of all the Law Examinations of the University, and the matter has accordingly been referred to the Law Committee for consideration and report.

27. During the year the syllabus for the Mining Course under the New Regulations was completed by the preparation of the syllabuses for the Third and Fourth Years' Examinations. The following Regulation for admission to the degree of B.Sc. in Mining Engineering under the new scheme was also adopted :

A candidate will be admitted to the Degree of B.Sc. in Mining Engineering, provided he shall have passed the Matriculation Examination (or such an examination as in the opinion of the Council is equivalent to the said Matriculation Examination), and subsequently the First, Second, Third and Final Mining Examinations.

28. With reference to the institution of a degree in Agriculture to which reference was made in last Report, the Council is glad to be able to state that considerable progress has been made with the preparation of syllabuses for the proposed degree; and it hopes to have the full scheme ready for publication at an early date.

29. As stated in last Report, the Council had resolved to apply to Parliament to obtain powers to confer Degrees in Divinity. A Bill to confer such powers was accordingly introduced during the last session of Parliament, and had reached its Second Reading when the Dissolution of Parliament stopped its further progress.

The Bill will be re-introduced during the next session, and the Council trusts that a measure, which has been so favourably received by all interested in the matter, will speedily receive Parliamentary sanction.

30. By far the most important University question at present under consideration is that of University reorganisation. This is rendered necessary, not only by the great educational progress which the Colony has made since 1873, when the University was established, but also by the fact that the Act of 1896 (under which the Transvaal, Orange River Colony and Natal are now represented on the University Council) requires amendment in order that each Colony may have an equitable share in the government of one strong University for the whole of South Africa. As stated in last Report this question of University reorganisation has received the attention of the Council since 1901, and after careful and protracted enquiry, a scheme was provisionally adopted in February last, subject to confirmation at a subsequent meeting.

About 18 months ago the attention of the Governments of the several Colonies was independently directed to the same question, and in accordance with the advice of the Directors of Education of four Colonies, a conference of 15 members, representing these Colonies and Southern Rhodesia, will be held at an early date in Cape Town, and the recommendations of this Conference will, it is hoped, lead to satisfactory legislation at an early date in the several Colonies concerned.

In view of this Inter-Colonial Conference the confirmation of the scheme of reorganisation provisionally adopted by the Council was allowed to stand over *sine die*.

31. The question of the institution of a School Leaving Certificate, to which reference has been made in previous Reports, is still receiving attention, and the Council hopes to be able to arrive at some decision in the matter at an early date.

32. The Council is glad to be able to report that the administrative portion of the new Buildings was completed during the year, and is now being occupied by the University and its officials; and the Council trusts that the financial conditions of the Colony will soon be such as to admit of the erection of the remaining portion of the buildings, in order that the University may have its own Hall for academic functions and its own examination rooms.

33. Appended to this Report are usual financial statements showing the receipts and expenditure for the year, and the position of each of the funds administered by the University.
