## Report of the Council of the University of the Cape of Good Hope for the Year 1892.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by command of His Excellency the Governor.  
1893.

1. The Council of the University of the Cape of Good Hope has the honour to present to His Excellency the Governor the following Report of its proceedings during the year 1892.

2. The resignation of Sir Langham Dale as a member of Council left a vacancy in the Council which was filled by the appointment, by Government, of Dr. Thomas Muir, Superintendent-General of Education. The Council took the opportunity of expressing to Sir Langham Dale its sense of the important services rendered by him to the University since its Incorporation in 1873.

3. The Hon. C. T. Smith, LL.D., was reappointed to a seat in the Council of the South African College.

4. In response to an invitation from the authorities of Trinity College, Dublin, to send a delegate to attend the Tercentenary of the Dublin University, the Council appointed the Rev. James Thompson, M.A., to represent this University on the occasion. Mr. Thompson proceeded to Dublin, and presented an address of congratulation from the Council.

5. The Subscribers to the Hampden Willis Testimonial Fund have handed over to the Council the sum of £115, the profits of which are to be given as a prize to be called the Hampden Willis Civil Service Prize, in memory of the late Hampden Willis, Esq., C.M.G., Under Colonial Secretary of this Colony. The prize will be awarded at the School Examinations of 1893, to the child or orphan of a civil servant of this Colony who obtains the highest place in the honours list.

The subject of the Dutch language at the Elementary Examination has again received the careful attention of the Council, and a resolution has been adopted in accordance with the recommendations of the Education Commission recently appointed by Government. In and after 1894 candidates at this Examination will be examined in the following subjects:—

- (a) The English language: *or* the Dutch language, at the option of the candidate.
- (b) Arithmetic.
- (c) History, English and Colonial.
- (d) Geography, Descriptive and Physical.
- (e) Handwriting.

Candidates who have selected English as a subject of examination may bring up Dutch as an additional subject, and *vice versa*: or they may bring up any one of the following additional subjects:—French, German, Sesuto, Kafir, Elementary Latin, and Elementary Science. No candidate may bring up more than one additional subject. The distribution of marks for these additional subjects is given in the University Calendar 1892-3, p. cxxviii.

11. The annual graduation ceremony was held in the Public Library on the 12th August, when the Vice-Chancellor, in the presence of the Council and the Convocation of the University, conferred degrees on those whom the Council had declared to be qualified to receive them, or had admitted, as Graduates of other Universities, to corresponding degrees in this University.

12. In the last report of the Council, reference was made to two subjects which had engaged the attention of the Council, viz., University Extension and Examinations in Music. During the year the Council granted the use of its hall to the Rev. Dr. Kolbe for a course of lectures as an experiment in the direction of University Extension. Unexpected delay has arisen in completing the arrangements for examination in music; but the Council trusts that during the present year it will be in a position to publish a scheme.

13. The Council desires to acknowledge the liberality of the Legislature in its grant to the University, both for general purposes and for bursaries to poor students.

14. Further dividends paid by the Liquidators of the Cape of Good Hope Bank have raised the amount recovered from the Bank to 17s. 6d. in the £.

15. A statement of all receipts and expenditure during the year, and a comparative statement of the results of all examinations conducted by the University since its incorporation in 1873, are appended to this report.
