Report of the Council of the University of the Cape of Good Hope for the Year 1894.

Presented to both Bonses of Parliament by Command of Dis Excellency the Covernor,

- 1. The Council of the University of the Cape of Good Hope has the honour to present to His Excellency the Governor the following Report of its proceedings during the year 1894.
- 2. The vacancy in the Council caused by the resignation of the Most Reverend W. W. Jones, D.D., Bishop of Cape Town, as reported in the Council's Report for 1893, was filled by the election, by Convocation, of the Rev. Canon Espin, M.A., of Grahamstown. Further vacancies arising during the year by the absence from the Colony of Professor Thomson, M.A., and A. Bodkin, Esq., M.A., were filled by the appointment of Professor Thomson by Government and the election of Mr. Bodkin by Convocation to the vacant seats.
- 3. Sir J. H. de Villiers, K.C.M.G., whose term of office as a member of the Council of the South African College expired on the 31st of March, was unanimously re-appointed to the office.

- 7. The first series of music examinations has been held during the year, with results which may be considered satisfactory. By the co-operation of the Royal College and the Royal Academy of Music in London with the University, the services of Professor Franklin Taylor were obtained, and it is believed that his visit to the Colony will greatly stimulate musical study and instruction. Professor Taylor conducted practical examinations in one or more departments of music at each of the following centres:—Burghersdorp, Cape Town, Graaff-Reinet, Graham's Town, Kimberley, Paarl, Stellenbosch, Uitenhage, Worcester and Wynberg. The number of candidates registered for examination was 355, and the Council has reason to believe that the number will be greatly increased in future. Arrangements are in progress for holding the second series of examinations in 1895.
- 8. The office of President of Convocation, vacant by the resignation of the Rev. Canon Ogilvie on his election to the Vice-Chancellorship, was filled by the unanimous election of the Rev. Thomas Walker, M.A., LL.D., to the office. Mr. George Gilchrist, B.A., has also been elected Secretary of Convocation in succession to the Rev. J. M. Russell, B.D., resigned. The Council took the opportunity of Mr. Russell's retirement to express to him, in a suitable way, the University's appreciation of the services rendered by him during his thirteen years' tenure of office.
- 9. Although no change of any importance has been made during the year in the Regulations for the various examinations, the expediency of

modifying in some respects the present programme of examinations has been more than once suggested. The Council is endeavouring to obtain in this matter the opinions of those whose judgment is considered of most value, and with this object in view has invited the Professors and Lecturers under the Higher Education Act to consider the present scheme of examinations, and to favour the Council with their views on the subject.

- 10. The Annual Graduation Ceremony was held in the Good Hope Hall, on the 10th of August, when the Vice-Chancellor, in the absence of the Chancellor, conferred degrees on those who were qualified to receive them, and addressed the congregation on the work of the University.
- 11. The Council while acknowledging the liberality of the Legislature in voting the supplies necessary for carrying on the various operations of the University, begs to call the attention of the Government to the very serious inconveniences arising from the want of suitable premises.
- 12. Appended to this Report are the usual statistical and financial statements for the year.
