This quarterly journal of student opinions and research on all aspects of race relations will be published by an Editorial Committee of students at the various Universities in South Africa and the Federation. There will be a central Committee at the University of the Witwatersrand, Johannesburg. The first edition will appear in February, 1962.

The journal has been launched with the following aims in view:-

- (1) To examine social, economic, political and cultural aspects of multi-racial communities throughout the world.
- (2) To endeavour to apply the information so gained to the particular situation in South Africa and, in so doing, to help to maintain cultural links between South Africa and the rest of the world on the University level, and to show other racial groups in this country that White students are willing and eager to discuss common problems in their proper perspective.

The success of this venture, which we feel can play an important role in both the South African and International student communities through discussion of such problems, will depend on the extent to which other student bodies are prepared to cooperate actively with us on all exchange or any other mutually acceptable basis. We, therefore, invite students and other interested persons to submit contributions of the following nature:-

Articles or comparative studies, literary, artistic or photographic, on social, cultural, political, economic or historical aspects of any multi-racial communities.

The magazine will be sold to students and the general public in South Africa and overseas. Copies will be sent to leading publications and journals. Contributions for the first edition, which can be returned, if requested, must reach the Editor at the above address not later than the 1st November, 1961.

We should be greatly obliged if students who are interested in the idea and wish to submit articles or other contributions, could let us know the nature and length of their articles or size of their pictures, as soon as possible. We would also welcome opinions and possible suggestions for improvements at this stage.
