Re: Application for Passport.

On February 23, 1960 I made application to your Department for two passports, one for myself and another for my wife. In my application I indicated that we required the passports to enable me accompanied by my wife to proceed to the United States of America where I had been offered an appointment as a Visiting Professor at Union Theological Seminary, Broadway at 120th Street, New York 27, N.Y. for the academic year 1960-61.

I indicated further that as there was a possibility that I might be offered similar appointments by other university institutions in the United States while I was there, I should be glad if the passports, if granted, would be made available for a period of three years.

On May 10, 1960 I was advised by the Magistrate and Bantu Affairs Commissioner of Alice that my application and that of my wife had not been successful.

I herewith beg to appeal to you for a re-consideration of our application. I may say that the authorities of Union Theological Seminary are still anxious to have me come to the United States, and as I had surmised, other university institutions have sent me similar invitations, notably from Brandeis University in Waltham, Mass. and New York State University at New Platz, New York. I am aware, of course, that there are certain differences between myself and the Government on matters of Native Policy, but my submission is that the Government would not on that account prevent me from accepting academic appointments of the nature referred to above.

All the documents relating to my application are still in the hands of your Department, the only one that has been returned to me being the Banker's Guarantee which was submitted to the Department of Bantu Administration and Development.

I should be much obliged if you would reconsider my application and grant me the facilities asked for.
