Tshokedi Khama	Chief Regent of Bamangwato people 1936 - 1949
Gorewang Kgama Sekgoma	Son of Kgama full brother of Chief Khama the father of the present Regent and grand-father of the heir -apparent. Chief's Representative Moshong District 1918-1949
Rasebolai Gorewang Kgama	Chief's Representative Bokalaka District 1931-1949 with 4 years interruption whilst on active service when he reached highest military rank open to Africans - Regimental Sergeant Major and received B.E.M.
( the above three persons are the first in the direct line of succession to Seretse).	
Gasebale Seretse Sekgoma	Teacher over 10 years and appointed to the position of Chief's Representative Gweta District 1938-1949.
Phethu Mphoen Sekgoma	Son of Mphoen half-brother of Chief Khama. The uncle who by his seniority of birth installed Chief Sekgoma father of Seretse, the heir apparent. Chief's Representative Madinare District, 1904-1949
Oten Mphoen Sekgoma	Full brother of Phethu 10 years school teacher, 10 year tax collector and assistant Chief's Representative to above brother.
Molwa Mkhutshwane Sekgoma	5 years school teacher 4 years on active service reached the highest rank open to Africans R.C.M. awarded M.B.E (Military Division) was a liason officer between British Officers and the Bechuanaland Pioneer Corps.
Badirwang Sekgoma	One of the two living brothers of the great Chief Khama and a permanent assistant to the Chief at the Chief's Court.
Potsoen Seropole Sekgoma	His father was half-brother to Chief Khama.
Rakosha Potsoen Seropole Sekgoma	Son of above. 4 years on active service attained second highest rank C.C.M.

Egoidintei J. Kgari

Headman of a section of the Bakwena Tribe domiciled in the Bamangwato Country and has 300 tax payers under him, a close relative of Chief Kgari Sechele of the Bakwena Tribe.

Etima Sephelelo

Son of headman of Bitharapa Village containing 200 tax payers and senior clerk of the chief's court 1938-1949

Ookane Sedimo

Headman Mabeledi Village, 120 tax payers and Chief's Representative Beetsa District 1943-1949.

Keako Nkobele

Headman Monyatso Village, 50 tax payers served Tribal Administration on various other capacities e.g. errands on administrative duties, tax collector in the Sand and Gasetted member of the Divisional Court.

Tuniso Muxhu

Assistant Chief's Representative Gweta District 1938-1949

Tlaseelang Boiteto

Headman Binokwane Village, 170 tax payers often called upon by the Tribal Administration on administrative duties in both the capital village and surrounding Districts.

Osefhetoge MATHIBE

Headman Magothu Village, 50 tax payers, tax collector in Tribal Administration 1929-1916, Chief Tax Collector 1917-1947 except for 5 years, often sent out on administrative errands Beetsa and Districts.

Morotai Molefhiinyane

Served the Tribal Administration as District Tax Collector 1934-1949.

Letshohile Motshelwa

Headman Sefhako Village, 120 tax payers, the Tribal Administration often sends him out on administrative errands Beetsa and Districts.

Boiditwe Mthuteng

Headman Basimane Village, a village of 400 tax payers, a Gasetted member of a Divisional Court Beetsa.

Mtswanen Mthoneni

Brother of Headman Basimane village, a village of 200 tax payers.

Gabolebye Dinti Marobela

Headman Moseki Village, a village of 50 tax payers. Has served Tribal Administration for 14 years in various capacities, school teacher, assistant Treasurer in the Tribal Treasury and at present in charge of the Grain control and distribution work.

<b>Bamarula Makhodi</b>	Headman Makhosi Village, a village of 340 tax payers, the best-known non-royal headman amongst the Basangwato Tribe and has considerable sections of the tribe placed under his charge and a Gazetted member of Divisional Court.
<b>Seitshiro Mosweu</b>	Second in charge to above.
<b>Gabosegwe Molotate</b>	For four years a Chief's Representative at Tonots
<b>Koketso Mokubang</b>	Served the Tribe in various capacities; school teacher, tax collector and court clerk
<b>Tshilwane Makhohile</b>	Headman of Manyadiwa Village, a village of 80 tax payers often called upon to perform administrative duties in Serowe and District, a very influential headman.
<b>Bareadi Gwathe</b>	Appointed to Tax Department 1936-1938 became Chief Tax Collector 1938-1940 seconded to the Bechuanaland Protectorate Government to assist in war work 1941-1946. Came to the Tax Department as Chief Tax Collector 1947-1949
<b>Bafheketeo Sewelabodiben,</b>	Headman Sekgama Village, a village of 80 tax payers and often called upon to perform administrative duties.
<b>Keithokile Manketane</b>	Headman Makholebyane Village, a village of 200 tax payers, this headman and his village were transferred from Serowe to the Bokalaka District to assist the Administration to restore order in the Area due to the Nswazi disturbance.
<b>Letseletse Dintzen</b>	Headman Boekgonosokopu Village, a village of 200 tax payers, Chief's Representative Botletli District 1936-1949.
<b>Neo Mosiakgabo</b>	Headman Makhono Village, a village of 400 tax payers often called upon to assist Chief's Representative in the Botletli District Gazetted member of Divisional Court.
<b>Bakwena Moserwa</b>	Headman Tshigana Village, a village of 100 tax payers, Chief's Representative Mookane Village.
<b>Inyateen Monahan</b>	Headman Modikwana Village, a village of 30 tax payers.
<b>Egolo Goiteekgosi</b>	Headman Sekga Village, a village of 30 tax payers.
<b>Amosele Molelekwa</b>	Headman Sekao Village, a village of 130 tax payers.
<b>Manyanya Molefhi</b>	Member of above village, and most influential member in this village

**Makobe Sebina**

Headman Sebina Village, a village of 500 tax payers, 1918-1930 served the tribe as a school teacher, 1931-1937 was Tribal Secretary, 1938-1942 Treasurer in the Tribal Treasury, 1946-1949 accountant in the Treasury.

**Letebele Sesone**

Sub-headman above village, over 10 years a school teacher.

**Sadie Moga**

Headman Teko Village, a village of 40 tax payers.

**Makgale Selepong**

Served Tribal Administration since 1938 in various capacities, first as a clerk then as Tribal Secretary, and now Tribal Treasurer 1943-1949.

**Makobe Mogopi**

Headman Mathuba Village.

**Ramamelwane Boipego**

Sub-Headman Mathuba Village

**Mokgobye Mathware**

Member of Egope Village, often called to perform administrative duties.
