ODL Policy

• Open Distance Learning (ODL) is a multidimensional concept aimed at bridging the time, geographical, economic, social, educational and communication distance between student and institution, student and academics, student and courseware and student and peers. Open distance learning focuses on removing barriers to access learning, flexibility of learning provision, student centeredness, supporting students and constructing learning programmes with the expectations that students can succeed.

• **Library services**: students are provided with access to library resources that facilitate their studying and production of knowledge. Library items can be issued from and returned to regional libraries. Students can also carry out searches; download online resources and other activities available to students.


