
Archives

Archives

A collection of historical records, or the physical place they are located. Archives contain primary source documents that have accumulated over the course of an individual or organization's lifetime, and are kept to show the function of an organisation


It consist of records that have been selected for permanent or long-term preservation on grounds of their enduring cultural, historical, or evidentiary value

Archival records are normally unpublished and almost always unique, unlike books or magazines for which many identical copies exist






Abstract:	GAELIC was a regional academic library consortium founded in April 1996 as a programme of FOTIM (Foundation of Tertiary Institutions of the Northern Metropolis). It was initially established to collaborate in the purchase of a common library system but its focus evolved to ensuring the effective use of the library system; skills development and capacity building of member library staff and seeking opportunities for resource sharing and cooperative purchasing. Its benefits include: providing networking opportunities among member library staff, collaborative projects, access to collective resources and cost-effective practices through for example a wide variety of workshops, training sessions, marketing events and information sessions for its entire member library staff. 

Dear Prof.,

I was happy to receive your letter, and I think the Ministor's conduct was thoroughly disgusting. We have decided hot to enter into a newspaper war with him for the time being, until we have done what we can to assist you in solving a very difficult problem.

The Working Committee appreciates the difficult decision you have to make, it has not discussed the matter fully because it felt that before it does so, it must seek the reaction of the Chief, as also your own inclinations, as this problem involves important political and personal considerations.

The Minister's statement has despite the fact that it is untrue, further complicated the situation. It seems to me that apart from arousing African opinion against you, it was also intended by the Minister, who know that what he said to be untrue, to be an attempt to get you not to accept appointment, by compelling you to refute his statement and make a declaration about your allegiance to Congress. It is difficult to see what else could have prompted such a thoroughly dishonest statement.

We hope we shall soon hear from you so that the W.C. could give its most serious consideration to the problem.
