

CURRICULUM VITAE OF MICHAEL D. ROBERTS

I graduated from Temple University in 1996 with an undergraduate degree in Business Administration (with high honors). From there, I went on to earn the degree of Master of Divinity (with honors) from Biblical Theological Seminary, where upon finishing in 2000 I was the recipient of the Greek Exegesis Award. After this, I went on to pursue doctoral studies at the University of South Africa. My subject of focus is New Testament studies, with the Gospel of John as my area of specialization.

I am a member of Beta Gamma Sigma, which is the national honorary society for business students, (1996), the Evangelical Theological Society (2001), and the Society of Biblical Literature (2002).

As part of my internship requirements for Biblical Theological Seminary, I taught a nineteen-week church elective on the person and work of Jesus. This material was an expanded version of a course in Systematic Theology at Biblical. It included preparing a lengthy class handout (approximately thirty pages), and distributing an evaluation sheet for each student. I have continued church teaching on Wednesday evenings numerous times, an assignment that is normally reserved for members of the Board of Elders. My most recent series was a three-month discussion on postmodernism. While at Biblical, my academic program included the two required courses on homiletics, and I have preached in my church in the evening service. As my doctoral studies come to a conclusion, I am eager for the opportunity to teach, preferably at the undergraduate or graduate level.
