



BY SA	CC BY SA	This license allows re-users to distribute, remix, adapt, and build upon the material in any medium or format, so long as attribution is given to the creator.
	CC BY NC	S Only noncommercial uses of the work are permitted
	CC BY NC SA	O Adaptations must be shared under the same terms
CC DY D	CC BY ND	No derivatives or adaptations of the work are permitted
	CC BY NC ND	This license allows reusers to copy and distribute the material in any medium or format in unadapted form only, for noncommercial purposes only, and only so long as attribution is



### **Referencing OER**

When creating attributions, a good rule of thumb is to use the acronym TASL, which stands for Title, Author, Source, License. ...

- **Title** What is the name of the material?
- If a title was provided for the material, include it.
  Sometimes a title is not provided; in that case, don't worry about it.

- Author Who owns the material?
- Name the author or authors of the material in question. Sometimes, the licensor may want you to give credit to some other entity, like a company or pseudonym. In rare cases, the licensor may not want to be attributed at all. In all of these cases, just do what they request.

- **Source** Where can I find it?
- Provide the source of the material, this is usually a URL or hyperlink where the material resides.
- License How can I use it?
