This separation is of course responsible for the mixed feeling. We know only too well that it is a separation which fosters more unity than ever before in this a noble & painful cause.

It would seem that there is no sphere of our lives which is not haunted by the ghost of Apartheid, appearing in all forms - I mean the new ordeal facing you re - University Apartheid. How are you all keeping, I hope very well. When I left home Shimie & the kids were doing very fine.

We have adjourned to the 2nd. of Feb. when the Defences will file an application to quash the indictments. The rest is as reported in the press; Application by defence of change of Venue - dismissed. We are leaving for Natal tomorrow with Chief. When I come up, I will come with Shimie. Best wishes & Compliments of New Year.
