You probably know that Mr. A. M. Phahle was in a similar position, but having an offer of research accommodation at the University of Manchester he was able to obtain an exit permit through the good offices of the British Passport Office in Cape Town. However, I am aware of the disadvantages of holding an exit permit. Just now I am trying to obtain information as to how the British authorities may assist people in his position to go overseas from here.

Could you please let me know what sum is involved in assisting your son at Birmingham? If our Society were able to help it would have to be indirectly, as our support can be given only to the displaced university teacher. I shall be glad to submit to our Allocation Committee a note of your position, but it would be advisable for me to be able to quote the figures.

I am grateful to you for the testimonial you have given for Lady Agnew. If no temporary College Fellowship is available for her in Oxford - I am waiting to hear about that - I am sure our Committee will do their utmost to help her.

I shall write you again when I have further news.
