I become president of Baker University on August 1 in Baldwin City, Kansas.


I am interested in establishing an extension of Baker University in Africa in an undeveloped country. I would prefer to have it in an English speaking nation in Africa which would facilitate lectures from the standpoint of visiting professors from America, professors on sabbatical, and others recruited from English speaking countries.

Countries which would lend themselves for African higher education would include Zambia, Malawi, Rhodesia, and your country. Three times in recent years I have been in central and southern Africa but have never visited your country.

I will be vacationing in New Hampshire during July and if your responsibilities bring you to New York during that time, I would hope we might be able to get together to talk.

Any way I can be of help in our common task of assisting African education, I stand ready to do so.
