
However, there is some chance that I might be able to get a small grant for lay education experiments in your country. I have had a confidential talk with the Episcopal bishop of Southern Ohio, Roger Blanchard, and he is able to influence a small private foundation in this direction. I shall be in New York City October 17-19, and perhaps there might be a chance to talk this over.

Maybe we can do nothing this year, and we had better wait for a little while. Maybe we ought not to miss this opportunity. The grant would probably be only something like \$1,500 in the first instance, but this is a beginning.

Anyway, I enclose my addresses for the next week or two in case you would like to get in touch with me. I am very sorry to bother you at such short notice when you are undertaking your new responsibilities, but I think it is worthwhile trying to get in touch with you.
